Nicole Reich served as CEO of important financial companies for more than 20 years across different geographies mainly in Latin America. She was the first female CEO of major banks in all the countries she lived in. She has also served as an Independent board Member in Mexico, Latin America and the USA for the last 9 years for public and private companies.

Today she is President of the board of BNP Paribas Cardif Mexico where she was the CEO for the last 8 years until December 2021. She is also a board member for Genera Financial group, Banco Compartamos and BBB Foods Inc. (Tiendas 3b).

In the Financial institutions, she is the President of the risk committee and acted previously as the president of the governance committee. For BBB foods Inc., she is the president of the Audit committee and a member of the Compensation committee.

Additionally, she was recently elected as Vice-President of the Mexican Insurance Association and leads the Diversity and Inclusion committee for the industry association.

As the CEO of BNP Paribas Cardif Mexico, she was responsible of the turnaround of the franchise, tripling the size of the company and signing two long-term agreements with financial institutions for the Bank assurance business. Ranked consecutively since her arrival as one of the top companies to work in Mexico.

At Scotiabank, she was the first non-Canadian based Executive Vice President for the global bank and President and CEO of Scotiabank Mexico with total assets of US\$ 17 Billion, 710 branches and 11,000 employees.

During her tenure at Citigroup International, she was responsible for the development of the Consumer franchise in Mexico, the turnaround of the Peruvian franchise, the integration of the Bank in Dominican Republic following two M&As, one with a bank and the other with an insurance company. In Chile, on top of running the bank she was also head of the West region and Diversity leader for all Latin America.

Before those experiences, she was a full time professor at Instituto Tecnológico de Monterrey (ITESM) and worked in the automobile sector for Chrysler Company Mexico.

She is recognized as one of the most important female leaders in Latin America by multiple publications including Bloomberg, Forbes, CNN Expansion and others and has received multiple recognitions over the years in the Dominican Republic, Peru, Chile and Mexico. In March 2011, she was awarded “Women of the year” by the Mexican Senate. In 2009, her Excellency the General Governor of Canada, recognized for her contribution to the Mexican-Canadian relationship.

She is a qualified financial expert also interested in leadership, retail business, education, automobile sector and technology. She has vast experience in mergers and acquisitions.

She is an established leader interested in Diversity and development of young professionals. As such, she is also part of the board of Junior Achievement Mexico, International women forum Mexico Chapter and Women Corporate Directors Mexico. She is also an active member of YPO Mexico.

She holds an MBA from the Instituto tecnologico de Monterrey (ITAM), a Computer Bachelor degree of the Instituto tecnologico de Monterrey (ITESM) both with honors. She has also additional postgraduate’s degrees including Harvard and Kellogg universities.
